01/AC-25/26 Confirmation of the Minutes of the 24th Meeting of Academic Council held on 3rd January, 2026.

The minutes of the 24th meeting were circulated vide L.No.-BASU/Reg./Acad./F.No.-01(21)/1771 dated 05.01.2026.

No comments have been received; the proceeding of the 24th meeting is placed before the Academic Council for confirmation.

Resolution: Proceedings confirmed with following observations/ action to be taken:

- (i) The process of regular appointment of Medical Officer at CoF, Kishanganj be initiated. Till the regular appointment is done, Dean, CoF will follow up with District Administration for medical services minimum three days in a week at CoF campus.
- (ii) Session of Psychological Counselling for students also be arranged in all Colleges as per UGC guidelines.
- (iii) Necessary process be initiated for admission of foreign students in the University.
- (iv) The Academic Council has expressed grave concern about lackadaisical action in engagement of Adjunct professor and Guest Faculty for teaching the courses and advised that Dean, SGIDT should make necessary efforts in this regard to recommend suitable number of Adjunct Professors to be selected by the University.

07/AC-25/26 Post facto approval of O.O. No. BASU/Reg./Acad./F.No.-103/2332 dated 25.03.2026 regarding additional provision in clause No. 22.3 and 22.4 in Academic Regulation for B.Sc. (Poultry Production) Degree Programme.

The clause No. 22.3 and 22.4 has been added in Academic Regulation for B.Sc. (Poultry Production) Degree Programme in anticipation of approval from Academic Council. The clause(s) are as follows -

22.3 There shall be makeup examination only for mid—term examination during the academic session, if the Dean of the concerned college is satisfied that the student was unable to appear in the mid-term examination for valid reasons. He may direct the teacher to hold make-up examination for the student on payment of requisite fee of Rs. 200/- for each course in which make-up examination is sought and endorse a copy of this order to the Dean and the Registrar for record in the student's personal file. No fee would be payable if he /she was sent out to represent the University.

22.4 Provision of make-up examination will be normally available only once in an academic year. The students may be allowed for make-up

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examination only for mid-term examination on the following grounds:

- (i) If he/she falls seriously ill. In such a case he/she will have to submit a certificate of the University/College/PHC/ Government hospital Doctor duly authenticated by the warden regarding his/her illness.
- (ii) If he/she has taken leave on account of the death of his/her father, mother, brother or sister, spouse, child or grandparent.
- (iii) If he/she is sent out to represent the University in games or co-curricular activities, subject to the provisions of rules related to attendance.
- (iv) Results of make-up examination will, count along with the previous performance of the student during the term forwarding the final grade in the course concerned, it will be the responsibility of the students to get in touch with teacher and have a date fixed for the make-up examination in the manner prescribed below:
 - a) The students will be required to appear in the mid-term examination within twenty days from the last date of mid-term examination. Failing which students will not be allowed to appear in the make—up examination in any case.
 - b) The student will be required to appear in the mid-term make-up examination within fifteen (15) days from the date of students return to the campus after representing in the University in co-curricular activities.

The above mentioned provisions has been notified vide Office Order bearing No. BASU/Reg./Acad./F.No.-103/2332 dated 25.03.2026 in anticipation of approval of from the Academic Council meeting of the University.

- Examination Pattern of 60 Marks (Internal Evaluation) and 40 Marks (External Evaluation) as per recommendation of 6th Deans' committee for U.G. Programme may be opted for B.Tech. (D.T) and B.F.Sc. Programme with effective from the batch 2025.

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- It was also discussed to include the provision for minimum 35% passing marks in external, internal theory & practical separately in a particular course & overall scoring 50% minimum marks for passing a subject.

The Academic Council may consider the aforesaid proposal and pass appropriate decision.

Resolution: Approved for the examinations conducted under proposed guidelines. However, Academic Council has resolved to constitute a committee in respect of Agenda No. 07/AC-25/26 which will review and frame rules to be included in the RRI for all UG programmes (except B.V.Sc.&A.H.).

The council has decided the following :

1. In all UG programmes (except B.V.Sc.& A.H.) two mid-term examinations will be conducted and better performance will be considered for preparation of the result.
2. In case of courses having theory and practical both Internal and external Examination will have equal weightage (50:50).
3. Passing marks for Internal and External Examination will be of 40 % marks each separately and total passing marks will be 50 % to pass in the subject.

10/AC-25/26 University guideline for internal and external examination of students with benchmark disability.

The Resident Instruction Committee of the University in its 11th meeting held on 04.05.2026 vide its agenda no. 11.3 has considered the case of Mr. Ayush Raj (Roll No. SDT-285/20250 B.Tech. (DT) programme student (Batch -2025) admitted under DQ Quota, who is unable to write and speak effectively due to his disability.

The committee discussed in detail & considered the recommendations of 15th Board of Studies, SGIDT, Patna regarding examination accommodation for student admitted under disability quota. The RIC committee recommended the following for consideration of the Academic Council: -

In accordance with the University Grants Commission (UGC) guidelines for conduction of written examination for person with Benchmark Disabilities Mr. Ayush Raj may be granted to appear in all internal and external examination having an alternate question paper in the form of MCQ or True/False questions.

The Academic Council may consider the aforesaid proposal and pass appropriate decision.

Resolution: Approved for Theory Examination conducted for Mr. Ayush Raj.. However, student(s) for all other activities like practical exam will be evaluated as per University guidelines. Theory and practical Examinations of the student will be conducted under CCTV facility. Controller of Examinations will monitor the process.

11/AC-25/26 Implementation of a Uniform Fee Structure for State and out of State students in P.G. and Ph.D. degree programmes.

The PG Board of Studies of the University in its 18th meeting held on 02.05.2026 vide its agenda no. 18.1 has discussed the existing provision of fee

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structure of students admitted under Outside State quota, which are as follows -

Existing Provision: For Outside state quota students of P.G. and Ph.D. programmes, Fee shall be the same as prescribed for general student with additional tuition fee of ₹ 6000/- in each semester (Notified vide N. No. BASU/Reg./Acad./F.No.-01 (20)/294 dated 26.09.2025).

Proposal: There should be uniform fee structure for state as well as out-of-state quota students and no additional Tuition Fee for outside students.

- The proposal of Uniform Fee Structure was discussed and recommended by Board of Studies, CoF, Kishanganj in its 11th meeting held on 06.04.2026.
- The PG Board of Studies in its meeting unanimously recommended that a Uniform Fee Structure should be followed for state and out-of-state quota students not only in CoF, Kishanganj, but in all the constituent Colleges of the University.

The Academic Council may consider the aforesaid proposal and pass appropriate decision.

Resolution: Academic Council accepted the proposal to motivate research activities, attract the students from all over the India and making campus cosmopolitan and vibrant.

12/AC-25/26 Provision of fellowship support to P.G. and Ph.D. students of the Out-of-State quota.

The PG Board of Studies of the University in its 18th meeting held on 02.05.2026 vide its agenda no. 18.2 has discussed the existing provision and proposal of fellowship to the students admitted from outside state of Bihar, which are as follows -

Existing Provision:

Clause:- Clause-6.2.9. "University fellowship shall only be permissible to the resident of the state of Bihar."

Proposal: University Fellowship should be equally permissible to state and out-of-state quota P.G. and Ph.D. students.

Justification:

1. The above proposal was discussed in 11th meeting of Board of Studies, CoF, Kishanganj held on 06.04.2026 and recommended that University Fellowship should be equally permissible to state and out-of-state quota P.G. and Ph.D. students.
2. This will maintain heterogeneity among PG students.
3. Outside state quota seats remain vacant creating sub-optimal utilization of resources.
4. Various Agricultural/Veterinary Universities in India equally grant University fellowship to both state as well as out-of-state quota admitted students.



5. The PG Board of Studies unanimously recommended that University Fellowship should be equally permissible to state and out-of-state quota PG and PhD students.

The Academic Council may consider the aforesaid proposal and pass appropriate decision.

Resolution: Rejected.

13/AC-25/26 To start of M.V.Sc. programme in 10 Departments of College of Veterinary & Animal Sciences, Kishanganj.

The PG Board of Studies of the University in its 18th meeting held on 02.05.2026 vide its agenda no. 18.3 has discussed the proposal to starting the M.V.Sc. programme in Departments of College of Veterinary & Animal Sciences (COVAS), Kishanganj, which are as follows -

Presently, College of Veterinary & Animal Sciences (COVAS), Kishanganj is not offering PG programme. The PG Board of Studies unanimously recommended that M.V.Sc. programme in selected 10 Departments of COVAS should be started in order to strengthen Post Graduate research facilities as well as for proper utilization of manpower. The detail is as follows -

14/AC-25/26 Reduction in seats of M.F.Sc. programme in four Departments of College of Fisheries, Kishanganj viz. Aquatic Environment Management (AEM), Fish Genetics & Breeding (FGB), Fish Nutrition and Feed Technology (FNT) and Fisheries Resource Management (FRM).

The PG Board of Studies of the University in its 18th meeting held on



02.05.2026 vide its agenda no. 18.4 has discussed the proposal of Reduction in seats of M.F.Sc. programme in four Departments of College of Fisheries, Kishanganj, which are as follows -

The four Departments of College of Fisheries (CoF), Kishanganj viz. Aquatic Environment Management (AEM), Fish Genetics & Breeding (FGB), Fish Nutrition and Feed Technology (FNT) and Fisheries Resource Management (FRM) have sanctioned M.F.Sc. seats of 2+1, 2+1, 3+1 and 3+1, of state and outside state quota seats, respectively.

As per University Regulation, faculty having only Ph.D. degree can guide Master's students. Since the four departments of CoF have only one faculty with Ph.D. degree, hence revision in intake capacity has been proposed. The same has been recommended by Board of Studies, CoF, Kishanganj.

The PG Board of Studies unanimously recommended to reduce the seats making 1+1 seat (State + Outside state quota) in each of these four departments.

The Academic Council may consider the aforesaid proposal and pass appropriate decision.

Resolution: Approved

15/AC-25/26 To increase the intake capacity in M.V.Sc. programmes in Clinical Departments of BVC, Patna viz. Veterinary Medicine, Veterinary Gynaecology & Obstetrics as well as Veterinary Surgery & Radiology at BVC, Patna.

The PG Board of Studies of the University in its 18th meeting held on 02.05.2026 vide its agenda no. 18.8 has discussed the proposal to increase the intake capacity in M.V.Sc. programmes in Clinical Departments of BVC, Patna, which are as follows -

Since all the Clinical Departments of Bihar Veterinary College, Patna are getting good number of clinical cases and looking into sufficient number of eligible Faculty in these Departments to guide M.V.Sc. students, it is proposed to increase one (1) seat in following Department under **State quota seats**.

The 18th P.G. Board of Studies unanimously recommended to increase 1 M.V.Sc. seat under State quota in each of the three Clinical Departments of BVC, Patna

The Academic Council may consider the aforesaid proposal and pass appropriate decision.

Resolution: Approved to increase one (1) additional seat under State quota in above mentioned three Departments from current Academic Session. The Council has also decided that admission in PG and Ph.D. programmes shall be made as follows –

- (i) P.G. and Ph.D. Programmes in Veterinary Science – First Semester (July to December) and Second Semester (January to June).

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(ii) P.G. and Ph.D. Programmes in other disciplines – First Semester (January to June) and Second Semester (July to December).

16/AC-25/26 Conversion of vacant reserved seats of postgraduate programmes into unreserved seats for Bihar Domicile Candidates in Bihar Animal Sciences University, Patna.

Background

The postgraduate programmes of Bihar Animal Sciences University are aimed at producing qualified human resources specialized in the fields of Veterinary and Animal Sciences, Dairy Technology, and Fisheries Sciences. Admissions to various postgraduate courses are conducted on the basis of merit among eligible candidates appearing in the postgraduate entrance examination/admission process.

During each academic year, seats in every postgraduate department are distributed subject-wise/department-wise as per the roster point reservation policy of the Government of Bihar. However, it has been observed during the last several academic years that many reserved category seats remain vacant even after completion of the admission and counselling process due to the non-availability of eligible candidates in the respective reserved categories.

Further, such vacant seats are not carried forward to subsequent academic sessions, resulting in underutilization of available academic infrastructure, faculty resources, laboratory facilities, research facilities, and financial resources of the University. Consequently, valuable opportunities for the production of skilled postgraduate human resources are also lost.

Proposal

1. Reserved seats of postgraduate programmes remaining vacant after completion of the second counselling and exhaustion of the merit list of the respective reserved categories may be converted into open/unreserved seats.
2. Such converted seats may be filled strictly on merit from among eligible Bihar domicile candidates appearing in the postgraduate entrance examination/admission process.
3. The conversion may be permitted only after ensuring that no eligible candidate from the concerned reserved category remains available for admission.
4. The above provision may be implemented for all postgraduate programmes of the University from the forthcoming academic session onwards.

The Bihar Animal Sciences University Act, 2017 at 6 (2) Admission to the University provide following provisions-

“(2) Subject to the provisions under sub section (1), the University shall reserve seats for scheduled castes, scheduled tribes and other categories specified by the Government, provided that such person shall have the qualifications and standards prescribed for that category.”

The Academic Council may consider the aforesaid proposal and pass appropriate decision.

Resolution: Approved and Recommended for obtaining the approval of the Government of Bihar for conversion of reserved seats into unreserved category.



Reservation of one seat under ward quota for regular staff of BASU in B. Tech (Dairy Technology) programme at SGIDT Patna.

The Board of Studies of Sanjay Gandhi Institute of Dairy Technology, Patna in its 16th meeting held on 04.05.2026 vide its agenda No. 16.1 has discussed the proposal of Reservation of one seat under ward quota for regular staff of BASU in B.Tech. (Dairy Technology) programme, which are as follows –

It was proposed to reserve one seat under Ward Quota of regular staff of BASU in the B. Tech (DT) programme. The eligibility and admission modalities shall be the same as followed at College of Fisheries, Kishanganj and Bihar Veterinary College, Patna. The proposed admission modalities under Ward Quota are:

1. The wards of only regular employees of Bihar Animal Sciences University (Teaching and Non-teaching) shall be eligible for admission in the B. Tech (DT) programme under the ward/staff quota.
2. Any type of further reservation shall not be applicable for admission in the B. Tech (DT) degree programme at SGIDT, Patna, under this quota.
3. The admission shall be made only on the basis of the JEE mains/BCECEB merit (as for other seats of the state quota) of the eligible candidates as per normal admission process.
4. The admission in the programme shall be made after counselling, of JEE mains/BCECEB qualified eligible students, by BCECE, Patna (as for other seats of the state quota) only.
5. The admission fee for students admitted under this quota shall be the same as applicable to general quota students for admission in the B. Tech (DT) degree programme in the university.
6. All other terms and conditions shall remain the same as applicable for others seats of the state quota

The 16th BOS recommended the proposal for the approval of Academic Council.

The Academic Council may consider the aforesaid proposal and pass appropriate decision.

Resolution: Approved

18/AC-25/26 Approval and implementation of dress code for B.Tech. (D.T.) students of 2026 Batch.

The Board of Studies of Sanjay Gandhi Institute of Dairy Technology, Patna in its 16th meeting held on 04.05.2026 vide its agenda No. 16.2 has discussed the proposal of implementation of dress code for B.Tech. (D.T.) students of 2026 Batch, which are as follows –

To promote discipline, uniformity, and professional academic environment dress code has been introduced to the B.Tech.(D.T.) Students. There is no dress code for the 2026 batch of B.Tech. (D.T.) students. Although dress code has been implemented in 2024 and 2025 batch of B. Tech. DT. Students as per the approval of Academic Council.

It is proposed that following formal dress code shall be introduced and implemented to the 2026 batch students of B.Tech.(D.T.) programme-

- Male students: Cream shirt, navy blue trouser, black shoes
- Female students: Cream kurti, navy blue salwar, blue dupatta, black shoes (optional shirt & trouser)

The 16th BOS recommended the proposal for the approval of Academic Council.

The Academic Council may consider the aforesaid proposal and pass appropriate decision.

Resolution: Dean of the concerned college is authorised to take appropriate decision.

19/AC-25/26 Introduction of dress code for B.Tech. (Food Technology) students of 2026 Batch (First Batch).

The Board of Studies of Sanjay Gandhi Institute of Dairy Technology, Patna in its 16th meeting held on 04.05.2026 vide its agenda No. 16.3 has discussed the proposal of Introduction of dress code for B.Tech. (Food Technology) students of 2026 Batch (First Batch), which are as follows –

To ensure discipline and professional culture from the inception of the programme and to differentiate between the students of two programmes viz. B. Tech. (DT) and B.Tech. (Food Technology)

In light of the commencement of the B. Tech (Food Technology) programme from 2026, the formal dress code, including separate attire provisions for male and female students is being proposed:

- Male students: Cream shirt, black trouser, black shoes
- Female students: Cream kurti, black salwar, black dupatta, black shoes (optional shirt & trouser).

It is a new proposal for this new programme.

The 16th BOS recommended the proposal for the approval of Academic Council.

The Academic Council may consider the aforesaid proposal and pass appropriate decision.

Resolution: Dean of the concerned college is authorised to take appropriate decision.

20/AC-25/26 Provision of stipend for B. Tech (Food Technology) students from 2026 Batch and onwards.

The Board of Studies of Sanjay Gandhi Institute of Dairy Technology, Patna in its 16th meeting held on 04.05.2026 vide its agenda No. 16.4 has discussed the proposal of stipend for B. Tech (Food Technology) students from 2026 Batch and onwards, which are as follows –

In the light of commencement of the B.Tech (Food Technology) programme from 2026, it is proposed to extend stipend benefits from the 2026



(first batch) and onwards as per the Government of Bihar provisions, on the same pattern as applicable to B.Tech.(DT) students i.e. Rs 2000/- per month per students as stipend and Rs. 6000/- per student per year as contingency.

To maintain uniformity with existing B.Tech.(DT) and other undergraduate programmes of BASU. Students. It is a new proposal for this new programme.

The 16th BOS recommended the proposal for the approval of Academic Council.

The Academic Council may consider the aforesaid proposal and pass appropriate decision.

Resolution: Approved and recommended to get approval from Government of Bihar for provision of stipend and annual contingency to B. Tech (Food Technology) students.

21/AC-25/26 Proposal for establishment of Directorate of Farms at Bihar Veterinary College, Patna and inclusion/modification of designation of “Head” to “Director, Farms (LFC), BVC, BASU, Patna.

The Board of Studies of Bihar Veterinary College, Patna in its meeting held on 02.05.2026 vide its agenda No. 1 has discussed the proposal for establishment of Directorate of Farms at Bihar Veterinary College, Patna and inclusion/modification of designation of “Head” to “Director, Farms (LFC), BVC, BASU, Patna, which are as follows –

1. Background:

Bihar Veterinary College, functioning under Bihar Animal Sciences University (BASU), Patna, maintains various livestock rearing & welfare activities viz. proper housing, feeding, sanitation & Hygiene, Health care under the Livestock Farm Complex (LFC) which play a crucial role in teaching, research, and extension activities. These farms serve as practical training units for undergraduate and post-graduate students, support research experiments, and act as demonstration units for farmers and stakeholders.

At present, the farms are managed under a fragmented administrative structure with the overall supervision of the “Head” of LFC. With increasing academic demands, expansion of farm activities, and the need for improved productivity and accountability, the existing arrangement is no longer adequate.

2. Justification:

The establishment of a “Directorate of Farms” is proposed in view of the following: -

- Integrated Management: To bring all farm units under a unified administrative and technical framework for better co-ordination and efficiency.
- Academic Support: To strengthen practical teaching, hands-on training, and research support for students and faculty.
- Enhanced Productivity: Scientific management of livestock and farm resources will improve productivity and resource utilization.
- Accountability and Monitoring: A structured system will enable better



supervision, performance monitoring, and outcome-based management.

- Extension and Outreach: Farms can be developed as model demonstration units for farmers, entrepreneurs, and trainees.
- Alignment with National Standards: Similar structures exist in leading veterinary universities, ensuring better governance and farm development.
- Further, to align with the proposed Directorate structure and to strengthen leadership:
- The current designation of “Head, LFC” needs to be upgraded to “Director, Farm (LFC), BVC, BASU, Patna”.
- This change will provide appropriate prestige, administrative authority, improve decision-making, and reflect the expanded scope of responsibilities.

3. Proposal: It is proposed that-

- i A Directorate of Farms be established at Bihar Veterinary College under Bihar Animal Sciences University, Patna.
- ii The Directorate will supervise all livestock farms and related units under the Livestock Farm Complex.
- iii The designation of “Head, LFC” be converted to “Director, Farm (LFC), BVC, BASU, Patna”.
- iv The Director will function as the administrative and technical head of the Directorate of Farms.

4. Financial Implications-

The proposal involves minimal additional financial burden, as outlined below: -

- Upgradation of Designation: Pay structure may remain unchanged unless revised separately as per university norms.
- No immediate financial implication, as it primarily involves change in nomenclature and responsibilities.
- Administrative Setup: The Directorate can initially function using existing infrastructure, staff, and resources available within LFC.
- Future Requirements (if approved separately):
 - Strengthening of manpower (technical and supporting staff)
 - Modernization of farm infrastructure
 - Procurement of equipment and inputs These may be taken up in a phased manner subject to availability of funds and separate approvals.
- Revenue Generation Potential: Improved farm management is expected to enhance income generation through sale of livestock products (milk, meat, eggs, breeding stock, etc.), thereby partially offsetting operational costs.

5. Expected Outcomes-

- Improved farm governance and operational efficiency

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- Strengthened teaching and research support
 - Increased farm productivity and revenue generation
 - Better training and demonstration facilities for stakeholders
 - Enhanced institutional reputation and compliance with academic standards

6. Approval Sought: Approval is solicited for-

1. Establishment of Directorate of Farms at Bihar Veterinary College, BASU, Patna.
2. Conversion of designation of “Head, LFC” to “Director, Farm (LFC), BVC, BASU, Patna”.

The Academic Council may consider the aforesaid proposal and pass appropriate decision.

Resolution: Approved for change of nomenclature of HoD to Director, LFC. However, no additional monetary benefits shall be admissible in this regard. Director, LFC at Bihar Veterinary College, Patna will have financial and administrative powers equivalent to the post of Head of the Department i.e. no change. Director, LFC will in no case be considered as Officer of the University.

22/AC-25/26 Proposal for establishment of Directorate of Clinics at Bihar Veterinary College, Patna and inclusion/modification of designation of “Head” to “Director, Clinics, BVC, BASU, Patna.

The Board of Studies of Bihar Veterinary College, Patna in its meeting held on 02.05.2026 vide its agenda No. 2 has discussed the proposal for establishment of Directorate of Clinics at Bihar Veterinary College, Patna and inclusion/modification of designation of “Head” to “Director, Clinics, BVC, BASU, Patna, which are as follows –

The Veterinary Clinical Complexes (VCCs) of Bihar Veterinary College, Bihar Animal Sciences University, Patna, Provide specialized animals health services, clinical teaching, and hands-on training to undergraduate and postgraduate students. With the growing demand for advanced veterinary services, diagnostic facilities and specialized treatment, there is a pressing need to streamline, strengthen and coordinate all clinical activities across the constituent colleges and associated institutions of BASU.

It is proposed to establish a Directorate of Clinics at Bihar Veterinary College, Bihar Animal Sciences University, Patna. This directorate will serve as the central coordinating and supervisory body for all clinical activities, veterinary hospitals and outreach services of the University.

Objectives of the Directorate:

1. To strengthen and standardize clinical teaching and training across all constituent colleges.
2. To improve the quality and efficiency of veterinary healthcare services offered through the University.
3. To facilitate integration of advanced diagnostic, therapeutic and surgical facilities.

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4. To develop specialized units such as cardiology, oncology, ophthalmology, dermatology, reproduction, critical care and transfusion medicine.
 5. To coordinate clinical research on region-specific animal health problems.
 6. To establish linkages with state animal husbandry departments, NGOs and private stakeholders for outreach programs.
 7. To generate revenue through paid clinical services, diagnostic facilities and consultancy.
 8. To ensure NABL, GLP and other quality accreditations for clinical laboratories.
 9. To initiate capacity building programs, workshops and continuing veterinary education (CVE) for field veterinarians.

The current designation of "Head, VCC" needs to be upgraded to "Director, VCC, BVC, BASU, Patna".

This change will provide appropriate administrative authority, improve decision-making, and reflect the expanded scope of responsibilities.

There is no existing provision.

The Academic Council may consider the aforesaid proposal and pass appropriate decision.

Resolution: Approved for change of nomenclature of HoD to Director, VCC. However, no additional monetary benefits shall be admissible in this regard. Director, VCC at Bihar Veterinary College, Patna will have financial and administrative powers equivalent to the post of Head of the Department without any changes. Director, VCC will in no case be considered as Officer of the University.

23/AC-25/26 Stipend disbursement for students of the B.V.Sc. & A.H. degree programmes.

The Board of Studies of Bihar Veterinary College, Patna in its meeting held on 02.05.2026 vide its agenda No. 3 has discussed the proposal for stipend disbursement for students of the B.V.Sc. & A.H. degree programmes, which are as follows –

The disbursement of stipend to the students are based on minimum of 75% attendance and a minimum OGPA of 5.00 in the last semester/Professional year, to ensure academic discipline and satisfactory performance as per MSVE REGULATION, 2016 OF VCI for B.V.Sc & A.H. degree programme and RRI, 2022 BASU for B.Tech (D.T.) and B.F.Sc programme. There is a need to streamline the mode and frequency of stipend disbursement in accordance with the academic framework of the constituent colleges.

Accordingly, it is proposed that the stipend be released on a quarterly basis for students of BVC, Patna (excluding first Professional year students), in order to ensure uniformity and administrative efficiency in stipend distribution.

The Academic Council may consider the aforesaid proposal and pass appropriate decision.

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Resolution: The Academic Council has recommended to revise the existing RRI accordingly and place before the next meeting of the Council.

24/AC-25/26 Internship allowance for regular students of Bihar Veterinary College, Patna.

The Board of Studies of Bihar Veterinary College, Patna in its meeting held on 02.05.2026 vide its agenda No. 4 has discussed the proposal for disbursement of internship allowance for regular students of Bihar Veterinary College, Patna, which are as follows –

The mode of disbursement of internship allowance for B.V.Sc. & A.H. students requires rationalization to ensure timely financial support to interns. For this, the internship allowance shall be disbursed to the interns on a quarterly basis.

The Academic Council may consider the aforesaid proposal and pass appropriate decision.

Resolution: Approved for the disbursement of internship allowance to the interns on monthly basis. Dean, BVC will be responsible to obtain attendance timely and authentically.

25/AC-25/26 Internship Allowance for the students admitted through Self-Finance Quota in B.V.Sc. & A.H. degree programme of Bihar Veterinary College, Patna.

The Board of Studies of Bihar Veterinary College, Patna in its meeting held on 02.05.2026 vide its agenda No. 5 has discussed the proposal of internship allowance for regular students of Bihar Veterinary College, Patna, which are as follows –

At present, there is no provision for payment of internship allowance to students admitted under the self-finance quota in the B.V.Sc. & A.H. degree programme. Since internship allowance is granted on the basis of prescribed working hours and duties performed during the internship period, it is considered appropriate and equitable that such students should also be entitled to receive the allowance.

To address this, internship allowance shall be extended to students admitted under the self-finance quota in the B.V.Sc. & A.H. degree programme, at par with regular students, and shall be disbursed on a quarterly basis.

The Academic Council may consider the aforesaid proposal and pass appropriate decision.

Resolution: Approved subject to disbursement to the interns will be made monthly and recommended for obtaining the approval from Government of Bihar.

26/AC-25/26 Provision of a monthly stipend and annual contingency for the students of B.Sc. (Poultry Production) degree programme.

The Board of Studies of Bihar Veterinary College, Patna in its meeting held on 02.05.2026 vide its agenda No. 7 has discussed the proposal of Provision of a monthly stipend and annual contingency for the students of B.Sc. (Poultry Production) degree programme, which are as follows –

- As the University has recently started the B.Sc. Poultry Sciences programme

and students are being admitted through the National Eligibility cum Entrance Test (NEET). At present, no stipend is being provided to the students, unlike students of other professional degree programmes, resulting in disparity.

- For this, stipend shall be initiated for students of the B.Sc. Poultry Sciences programme, at par with students of B.V.Sc. & A.H., B.Tech, and B.F.Sc. degree programmes.
- The B.Sc. (Poultry Production) programme at Bihar Veterinary College, Patna is a three (3) years residential specialized, skill-oriented technical undergraduate course designed to develop trained and competent manpower for the rapidly growing poultry sector. The curriculum emphasizes intensive practical training, field exposure, and hands-on experience in key areas such as poultry farm management, hatchery operations, nutrition, breeding, and disease control. Students are required to actively participate in farm practices, laboratory work, and field-based learning, which often involves additional academic and incidental expenses.
- The Government of Bihar extends financial support in the form of stipends to undergraduate students enrolled in technical institutions, subject to fulfilment of prescribed criteria. Since the B.Sc. (Poultry Production) programme is comparable in nature and rigor to other technical courses, it is justified that students enrolled in this programme be considered for similar financial benefits in line with existing provisions. Provision of a monthly stipend will assist students in meeting their essential academic and living expenses, enabling them to focus more effectively on skill acquisition and professional development.
- Additionally, an annual contingency grant will facilitate the purchase of study materials, minor equipment, and support field visits, project work, and practical training requirements. Such financial assistance will enhance the overall quality of education, improve student motivation and retention, particularly among economically weaker sections, and contribute significantly to the development of skilled poultry professionals to meet the demands of the state's livestock sector.

The Academic Council may consider the aforesaid proposal and pass appropriate decision.

Resolution: Approved and recommended for obtaining the approval for monthly stipend and annual contingency to the B.Sc. (Poultry Production) programme students from Government of Bihar.

27/AC-25/26 Approval of Course Numbers and new English Non-credit course for DVLD & DVLТ Diploma Courses.

The Board of Studies of Bihar Veterinary College, Patna in its meeting held on 02.05.2026 vide its agenda No. 8 has discussed the proposal of Course Numbers and new English Non-credit course for DVLD & DVLТ Diploma Courses, which are as follows –

- Allocation of Course Numbers to all theory and practical courses prescribed under the DVLD and DVLТ programmes.

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- Incorporation of new English Non-credit course (1+0) in First (PVE-111, Communicative English –I) and Second Semester (PVE-121, Communicative English –II).

There is a need of common course numbers to ensure uniformity and standardization in course structure while facilitating smooth conduct of examinations, efficient result processing, and proper academic record keeping including transcript generation. Further, incorporation of English Non-Credit Courses will enhance communication skills and supports for the better understanding of technical terminology.

The Academic Council may consider the aforesaid proposal and pass appropriate decision.

Resolution: Approved. It is also agreed that student of DVLD and DVLT programmes are allowed to write examination in Hindi /and or English.

28/AC-25/26 Approval of revised Certificate Course in Bovine Clinical Practice.

The Board of Studies of Bihar Veterinary College, Patna in its meeting held on 02.05.2026 vide its agenda No. 9 has discussed the proposal of revised Certificate Course in Bovine Clinical Practice, which are as follows –

1. Previously it was Post Graduate certificate in Bovine Clinical Practice.
2. The state is experiencing an increase in commercial dairy farms and high-producing dairy animals. Furthermore, farmers are becoming more aware of prophylaxis and the proper treatment of their valuable animals. Dairy farmers seek precise diagnosis and rational treatment for their animals. As a result, it is imperative that field veterinary practitioners and recent graduates have to improve their diagnostic and treatment skills. The best approach is to train veterinarians as species specialists. The Dairy, Fisheries and Animal Resources Department, Government of Bihar, may be requested to nominate its veterinary doctors for participation in this course, with provision for reimbursement of registration and course fees.

The Academic Council may consider the aforesaid proposal and pass appropriate decision.

Resolution: Approved. The certificate will be issued for “Bovine Clinical Practice Training”.

29/AC-25/26 Implementation of non-practicing allowance (NPA) to Faculty members/ Officers/ Veterinarians possessing B.V.Sc.&A.H. degree working in different Colleges/ Units/ KVKs of Bihar Animal Sciences University, Patna.

The Board of Studies of Bihar Veterinary College, Patna in its meeting held on 02.05.2026 vide its agenda No. 10 has discussed the proposal of implementation of non-practicing allowance (NPA) to Faculty members/ Officers/ Veterinarians possessing B.V.Sc.&A.H. degree working in different Colleges/ Units/ KVKs of Bihar Animal Sciences University, Patna, which are as follows –

The Board of Management of Bihar Animal Sciences University, Patna in its 2nd Meeting held on 28.09.2019 vide Agenda Item No. 1.2.7 had approved for grant of non- practicing allowance (NPA) to Faculty members possessing B.V.Sc.&A.H. degree subject to approval from Government of Bihar. This matter

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is under consideration at the Government level.

Since, the Government of Bihar has granted Non Practicing Allowance to all Allopathic Medical doctors as well as faculty members of IGIMS, Patna, the same Provision may be extended to Allopathic Veterinary doctors working as Faculty members/ Officers in Bihar Animal Sciences University.

1. The Faculty members/ Officers/ Scientists possessing B.V.Sc.& A.H. degree are entitled for grant of NPA as per UGC regulations, ICAR regulations.
2. Not only this, NPA to faculty members possessing B.V.Sc.& A.H. degree is being granted in various other Universities of the Country also.
3. Recently, Govt. of Bihar has granted Non Practicing Allowance to all Allopathic Medical doctors as well as faculty members of IGIMS, Patna.

Hence, the same Provision may be extended to Allopathic Veterinary doctors working as Faculty members/ Officers in Bihar Animal Sciences University, Patna.

The Academic Council may consider the aforesaid proposal and pass appropriate decision.

Resolution: Approved and recommended for the placing before the Board of Management and Govt. of Bihar.

To fill the unreserved/reserved teaching posts at CoVAS, Kishanganj, at the earliest, to full-fill compulsive VCI requirements and smooth conduct of UG/PG teaching at this newly establishing college.

The Academic Council may consider the aforesaid proposal and pass appropriate decision.

Resolution: Approved and recommended for approval of the Board of Management.

31/AC-25/26 Proposal for recruitment of Associate Professors and Professors on contractual basis.

The Board of Studies of College of Veterinary and Animal Science, Kishanganj in its 7th meeting held on 08.05.2026 has discussed the proposal for recruitment of Associate Professors and Professors on contractual basis, which are as follows –

Terms and Condition for Recruitment of Associate Professors and Professors on Contractual Basis:

Tenure: The appointment shall initially be for a period of Six Months from the date of joining, extendable up to three years based on institutional requirements and satisfactory performance.

Consolidated Remuneration: Associate Professor – ₹1,31,400/- per month & Professor – ₹1,44,200/- per month

Eligibility Criteria: PhD in relevant subject, teaching/research/extension experience as per recruitment norms of university, and evidenced by high-quality publications. The posts shall be open to all eligible candidates. Retired Professors/Professional from Universities shall also be eligible for appointment on contractual basis.

Age limit: Not more than 65 years.

The proposal is submitted to facilitate the earliest possible filling of vacant unreserved and reserved teaching positions at The College of Veterinary and Animal Sciences (CoVAS), Kishanganj. The appointment is essential for fulfilling compulsory VCI requirements and smooth conduct of UG and PG teachings in this newly established college.

The Academic Council may consider the aforesaid proposal and pass appropriate decision.

Resolution: Deferred.



32/AC-25/26 Approval/recommendation of the draft Career Advancement Scheme 2018 (CAS, 2018) for the promotion of the teachers working in the Bihar Animal Sciences University (BASU), Patna, Bihar.

In light of the aforementioned facts—and in accordance with the University Grants Commission Regulations, 2018, proposal is hereby presented to grant approval to the draft Career Advancement Scheme Scheme-2018 prepared by the committee for the promotion of teachers at Bihar Animal Sciences University, Patna and to recommend the same for the approval of the Board of Management. Proposal for Inclusion of Director Research in APAR Review Mechanism and Incorporation of Research Performance Assessment in APAR of Faculty Members of Constituent Colleges under Bihar Animal Sciences University.

Justification:

At present, the Annual Performance Appraisal Report (APAR) of faculty members of different constituent colleges of Bihar Animal Sciences University is endorsed by the respective Head of the Department as the Reporting Officer and the respective Dean as the Review Officer.

However, considering the growing emphasis on quality research output, external funding, innovation, publications, patents, institutional ranking, accreditation parameters, and national/international visibility of the University, there is a need to strengthen the research evaluation component within the APAR system. This would hold the faculties accountable towards the Director Research and Directorate of the Research, Bihar Animal Sciences University.

The following modifications in the APAR evaluation framework are proposed for consideration and approval by the Academic Council:

1. Inclusion of Director Research in APAR Review System

- The Director Research may be incorporated in the APAR

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evaluation hierarchy at the University level.

- The existing Dean of the respective college may function as:
 - **Review Officer at College Level**
- The Director Research may function as:
 - **Review Officer at University Level for research-related assessment and validation.**

2. Separate Research Evaluation Component in APAR

- A dedicated section/score column for research performance may be incorporated in the APAR of faculty members.
- The research assessment may include evaluation parameters such as:
 - Research publications
 - Funded research projects
 - Extramural grants
 - Patents/innovations/technologies
 - Student research guidance
 - Research collaborations
 - Awards and recognitions
 - Extension of research outcomes
 - Participation in conferences / workshops / training programmes
 - Institutional contribution towards University ranking and accreditation

3. Standardized Research Scoring Mechanism

- A uniform research scoring format may be developed by the Directorate of Research for implementation across all constituent colleges to ensure transparency, objectivity, and uniformity in evaluation.

Expected Outcomes:

The proposed system is expected to:

- Strengthen the research ecosystem of the University.
- Encourage healthy academic and research competition among faculty members.
- Improve quality and quantity of research outputs.
- Enhance extramural funding and collaborative research activities.
- Improve institutional performance indicators for accreditation and ranking frameworks.
- Facilitate better monitoring and recognition of research contributions of faculty members.
- Contribute significantly towards enhancing the academic and research profile of Bihar Animal Sciences University.

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Resolution Sought:

The Academic Council is requested to deliberate upon and approve the proposal for: -

1. Inclusion of Director Research in the APAR review framework at University level; and
2. Incorporation of a separate research evaluation and scoring component in the APAR of faculty members of constituent colleges under Bihar Animal Sciences University.

The Academic Council may consider the aforesaid proposal and pass appropriate decision.

Resolution: The Academic Council resolved to constitute a Committee with following members to review the existing APAR guideline of Faculty Members of constituent Colleges –

35/AC-25/26 Guideline of Maternity Leave rule for postgraduate women students.

A Committee has been constituted vide O.O. No. BASU/Reg./F.No.270(Dean PGS)/66 (Memo No. 208) dated 05.05.2026 for framing draft guideline of maternity leave for postgraduate women students, the recommendation of the committee is as follows –

These rules may be called as Maternity Leave as per UGC D.O. No. 21-116/2021 (CPP-II) dated 14.12.2021 and shall be applicable to all women students enrolled in postgraduate programmes of the University.

The objective of these rule is to ensure continuation of education during pregnancy and motherhood, prevent discontinuation of studies due to maternity, provide academic flexibility and attendance relaxation in accordance with UGC guidelines.

Eligibility and Duration of Maternity Leave

Any woman student of the University who is pregnant or has delivered a child during the course of study shall be eligible for maternity leave under these rule. A woman student may be granted Maternity Leave once in the entire duration of postgraduate programme for a maximum up to 180 days. The leave may be



availed either before delivery or after delivery or partly before and partly after delivery.

Attendance and Examination Relaxation

The period of Maternity Leave shall be treated as authorized absence. Attendance shortage arising due to Maternity Leave shall be condoned. The Head of the Department may arrange remedial classes, online instruction, practical re-demonstration and laboratory compensation wherever feasible. Women students on Maternity Leave may be granted permission to appear in supplementary/special examinations, extension of dissertation, thesis or project submission dates and carry-over of semester/academic requirements without penalty.

Procedure for Grant of Leave

The student shall submit an application at least three weeks before from the date of proposed leave in the prescribed format along with medical certificate from a registered medical practitioner/government hospital. The application shall ordinarily be submitted to the Dean of the concern college through the Head of Department and major advisor. Sanctioning authority will be DRI-cum-Dean, PGS for leave up to 90 days and Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor for leave beyond 90 days.

Fellowship During Maternity Leave

A woman research scholar shall be entitled to continue receiving fellowship admissible as per clause No. 6.2.6 of Regulation on Resident Instruction for Post-Graduate Degree Programme of the University during the sanctioned maternity leave period.

Women research scholars shall be eligible for Maternity Leave once in the entire duration of postgraduate programme for a maximum up to 180 days. Fellowship/stipend shall continue during the approved leave period in accordance with the clause No. 6.2.6 of Regulation on Resident Instruction for Post-Graduate Degree Programme of the University.

The Academic Council may consider the aforesaid proposal and pass appropriate decision.

Resolution: The Academic Council decided to approve temporary dropping to all students in case of maternity leave for minimum one semester and maximum two semester / one Academic Year on the basis of period of the maternity leave. Rules to be modified accordingly. Short duration absence shall be treated against existing relevant rules for medical leave.

36/AC-25/26 **Any other item with the permission of the Chair.**

36(i)/AC-25/26 **Establishment of New Veterinary College at Bikramganj, Rohtas.**

The Dairy, Fisheries and Animal Resources Department vide its L. No. संचिका सं०-6A ज.शि.(3)07/2025-1124 पटना-15 dated 27.02.2026 drawn the attention to the provision prescribed under section 11(2)(xii) of BASU Act, 2016

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concerning of the power and function of the Board, which states that-

"To consider and approve establishment of a new college or faculty, amalgamation of two or more colleges or faculties into a single college or faculty or abolition of a college or faculty or reconstitution of any of the existing faculties on the recommendation of the Academic Council."

After considering the above letter of Dairy, Fisheries and Animal Resources Department, Government of Bihar a Detailed Project Report (DPR) has been prepared for establishment of new Veterinary College at Bikramganj, Rohtas.

The matter is placed before the Academic Council for kind consideration and appropriate decision.

Resolution : The Detailed Project Report (DPR) for establishment of new Veterinary College at at Bikramganj, Rohtas was presented before the council. However, availability of land at the proposed place be ascertained.

36(ii)/AC-25/26 Proposal for arranging separate classes for a duration of 3 months for two students of the 4th Professional Year, B.V.Sc. & A.H. Degree Programme (Batch 2021), apart from the on-going professional classes, on compassionate grounds based on their applications.

Two (02) students from the 4th Professional Year of B. V.Sc. & A. H. degree programme (Batch: 2021), namely Bashist Kumar (Adm. No. BASU/BVP/0000262/2020 & Reg. No.VU0203/2020-21) and Saurav Kumar (Adm. No. BASU/BVP/0000270/2020 & Reg. No.VU0210/2020-21) were declared ineligible to appear in the Annual Examination commenced from 28.04.2026 due to shortage of class attendance vide O.O. No. 348/Edn./BVC, Patna dated 27.04.2026. In this regard, both students have submitted individual applications requesting consideration of their cases on compassionate grounds. They have admitted their mistakes and assured that such negligence shall not be repeated in future (copies enclosed).

I would like to draw your kind attention to the fact that the duration of the 4th Professional Year is 4 and ½ year. After completing the 4th Year, students are required to undergo a one-year rotational internship training program. In view of the academic future of these students and considering the substantial time already invested by them in the 4th Professional Year, it is proposed that separate classes for a duration of 03 months may be arranged for these students, apart from the on-going professional classes, so as to enable them to fulfil the prescribed attendance requirement and become eligible to appear in the final examination. However, it is also pertinent to mention that such provision is not explicitly available under VCI MSVE-2016 or the existing Academic Regulations of B.V.Sc & A.H. of the University.

It is further submitted that in the 21st Meeting of the Academic Council of BASU, and vide Notification No. BASU/Reg./Acad./F.No.-01(18)/41 dated 10.05.2025, a similar case involving three students with shortage of attendance was

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considered, wherein an additional six months' period was granted to enable them to fulfil the attendance requirement. It was, however, resolved that such cases should not be treated as precedent in future (Copy enclosed).

Additionally, it may kindly be noted that after completion of the 4th Professional Year, no further coursework remains except the compulsory one-year rotational internship programme. Therefore, if approved, this provision would be limited only to such exceptional cases of the 4th Professional Year and would not be applicable to students of the 1st to 3rd Professional Year. A bond could be obtained from these students, ensuring that such an issue will not be repeated in the future.

Resolution : Academic Council resolved to approve the following -

1. There shall be uniform extension of six months for students having reasonable deficiency in 75% attendance.
2. Additional fee shall be charged for six months i.e. 1/3rd of fee prescribed for 4th Professional year.
3. No fellowship shall be admissible for this additional six months period.
4. No separate Academic Calendar shall be made for the purpose. Such students will attend classes with regular batch to complete the attendance requirement.
